
While not all parts are labeled, some of the parts will have a label or an inked letter on the edge to help distinguish similar parts from each other. Use this part identification to help identify similar parts.

Hardware Identification


F Screws are shown actual size. You may receive extra hardware with your unit.




- Assemble your unit on a carpeted floor or on the empty carton to avoid scratching your unit or the floor.
- Fasten the LEFT END (T) and one BACK (Y) to the TOP (W). Use four BLACK 1-1/2" FLAT HEAD SCREWS (28).
- Fasten the BACK (Y) to the LEFT END (T). Use two BLACK 3/8" MACHINE SCREWS (34).




Remember: Righty tighty. Lefty loosey.




- Fasten the LEFT UPRIGHT (V) to the TOP (W). Use two BLACK 1-1/2" FLAT HEAD SCREWS (28).
- Fasten the BACK (Y) to the LEFT UPRIGHT (V). Use two BLACK 3/8" MACHINE SCREWS (34).




Fasten the MODESTY PANEL (AA) to the LEFT UPRIGHT (V). Use two BLACK 3/8" MACHINE SCREWS (34).



- Fasten the RIGHT UPRIGHT (U) to the TOP (W). Use two BLACK 1-1/2" FLAT HEAD SCREWS (28).
- Fasten the MODESTY PANEL (AA) to the RIGHT UPRIGHT (U). Use two BLACK 3/8" MACHINESCREWS (34).




- Fasten the RIGHT END (S) and remaining BACK (Y) to the TOP (W). Use four BLACK 1-1/2" FLAT HEAD SCREWS (28).
- Fasten the BACK (Y) to the RIGHT END (S) and RIGHT UPRIGHT (U). Use four BLACK 3/8" MACHINE SCREWS (34).




Fasten the SHELF (Z) to the LEFT END (T) and LEFT UPRIGHT (V). Use four BLACK 3/8" MACHINE SCREWS (34).







Fasten the BOTTOMS (X) to the ENDS (S and T) and UPRIGHTS (U and V). Tighten eight BLACK 1" HEX HEAD SCREWS (29) using the L-WRENCH (26).




- IMPORTANT: Be sure to keep SCREWS (32) separate from SCREWS (33). Do <u>not</u> confuse these SCREWS.
- Separate the EXTENSION SLIDES (21) from the EXTENSION RAILS (20) as shown in the upper diagram below. Be prepared, the parts are greasy.
- Fasten the EXTENSION RAILS (20) to the ENDS (S and T) and UPRIGHTS (U and V). Use twelve LARGE BLACK 1/2" FLAT HEAD SCREWS (32).
- NOTE: For each EXTENSION RAIL, turn a SCREW into the 1st hole shown in the diagram. Then, slide the inner cartridge of the EXTENSION RAIL in to find the other hole that lines up with the hole in the END/UPRIGHT. Turn a SCREW into this hole.
- <u>NOTE</u>: The EXTENSION SLIDES will be used later for the DRAWERS.




Turn eight ADJUSTABLE GLIDES (25) into the bottoms of the ENDS (S and T) and UPRIGHTS (U and V).

Fasten one SMALL DRAWER SIDE (DD) to the SMALL DRAWER BACK (EE) and SMALL DRAWER BOX FRONT (FF). Use four BLACK 1-9/16" FLAT HEAD SCREWS (27).



Slide one DRAWER BOTTOM (GG) into the grooves in the SMALL DRAWER SIDE (DD), the SMALL DRAWER BACK (EE), and the SMALL DRAWER BOX FRONT (FF).


3 Be sure the DRAWER BOTTOM inserts into GG the DRAWER SIDE groove. EE DD BLACK 1-9/16" FLAT HEAD SCREW Fasten the remaining SMALL DRAWER SIDE (DD) to the SMALL (4 used in Section 3) DRAWER BACK (EE) and SMALL DRAWER BOX FRONT (FF). Use four BLACK 1-9/16" FLAT HEAD SCREWS (27).

NOTE: Be sure the DRAWER BOTTOM (GG) inserts into the groove of the SMALL DRAWER SIDE (DD).

- First, fasten one PULL (24) to the SMALL DRAWER FRONT (BB). Use two BLACK 3/4" MACHINE SCREWS (31).
- Second, fasten the SMALL DRAWER FRONT (BB) to the SMALL DRAWER BOX FRONT (FF). Tighten four BLACK 7/8" HEX HEAD SCREWS (30) using the L-WRENCH (26).
- Fasten two EXTENSION SLIDES (21) to the SMALL DRAWER SIDES (DD). Use six SMALL BLACK 1/2" FLAT HEAD SCREWS (33).
- NOTE: Use the 1st, 4th, and 7th holes from the OPEN END in the EXTENSION SLIDE.





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

Fasten one LARGE DRAWER SIDE (HH) to the Į LARGE DRAWER BACK (JJ) and LARGE DRAWER BOX FRONT (KK). Use four BLACK 1-9/16" FLAT HEAD SCREWS (27).

Be sure the DRAWER BOTTOM inserts into the DRAWER SIDE groove. KK HH GG IJ

Slide one DRAWER BOTTOM (GG) into the grooves in Į the LARGE DRAWER SIDE (HH), the LARGE DRAWER BACK (JJ), and the LARGE DRAWER BOX FRONT (KK).




Repeat this step for the other large drawer.

- First, fasten one PULL (24) to the LARGE DRAWER FRONT (CC). Use two BLACK 3/4" MACHINE SCREWS (31).
- Second, fasten the LARGE DRAWER FRONT (CC) to the LARGE DRAWER BOX FRONT (KK). Tighten four BLACK 7/8" HEX HEAD SCREWS (30) using the L-WRENCH (26).
- Fasten two EXTENSTION SLIDES (21) to the LARGE DRAWER SIDES (HH). Use six SMALL BLACK 1/2" FLAT HEAD SCREWS (33).
- NOTE: Use the 1st, 4th, and 7th holes from the OPEN END in the EXTENSION SLIDE.
- Press two FILE GLIDES (22) onto the LARGE DRAWER SIDES (HH). Then place two FILE HANGERS (23) onto the FILE GLIDES (22) as shown.
- \mathbf{r} Repeat this step for the other large drawer.



- Carefully stand your unit upright.
- To insert a drawer into your unit, line up the EXTENSION SLIDES on the drawer with the EXTENSION RAILS on the unit and push the drawer into the unit until the drawer is fully inserted. The drawer will push in hard until it is all the way in, then it will slide in and out easier.
- **T** To level your unit, turn the ADJUSTABLE GLIDES on the bottom of the unit.
- NOTE: Please read the back pages of the instruction booklet for important safety information.
- This completes assembly. Clean with a damp cloth. Wipe dry.
